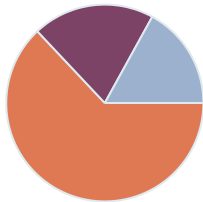

CFAES Water Quality Initiative

\$5 M five-year study via the CFAES Water Quality Initiative, which employs six Extension associates in northwest Ohio's Maumee River watershed – focusing on production strategies, technologies, and best management practices to improve fertilizer use efficiency and farm profitability while promoting soil health and reducing nutrient and sediment losses within the western Lake Erie basin. The USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service and Cargill are partnering with CFAES to support these positions.



USDA Rural Development Distance Learning and Telemedicine Program Grant

\$275 K USDA Rural Development Distance Learning and Telemedicine program grant focused on reducing opioid misuse, as well as improving treatment, prevention, and recovery services in Appalachian Ohio. Interactive video equipment installed at several locations will reach more than 43,000 rural residents in 8 counties who traditionally faced access, transportation, or cost barriers.
